

PUBLIC STATEMENT

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

I wish to inform the general public that I, **Joseph Blankson Adumadzie**, a citizen of the Republic of Ghana and staff of the Electoral Commission, have submitted a formal **petition to the President of the Republic of Ghana**, in accordance with **Article 146 of the 1992 Constitution**, seeking the **removal of Mrs. Jean Adukwei Mensa, the Chairperson of the Electoral Commission, Dr. Bossman Eric Asare (Deputy Chairperson-Corporate Services), and Mr. Samuel Tettey (Deputy Chairperson-Operations)** from office.

Without disclosing the content of the petition in accordance with law, the petition cites **twelve (12) counts of stated misbehaviour, including cronyism, abuse of office and gross incompetence**, which have collectively undermined public confidence in the Electoral Commission and pose a threat to the credibility, independence, and integrity of Ghana's electoral process.

This action is taken in the **supreme interest of the 1992 Constitution, accountable governance, and preservation of the dignity of the Electoral Commission.**

I have, therefore, respectfully prayed the President of the Republic of Ghana to act in accordance with his constitutional duty by referring the petition to the Chief Justice for the determination of a prima facie case.

I remain committed to upholding the principles of transparency, fairness, and integrity in our democratic institutions.
